Learning Together Activities



Support your child's reading journey by playfully practicing together!



Toyt Talk

- Point and Read: Slide your finger under the words while you read a book together.
- Print Play: Talk about the structure of the book (e.g., cover, title, author, words, letters, etc.).
- Punctuation Pointers: Point out punctuation, and talk about what it means.



Phonics Fur

- Memory Match: Write uppercase and lowercase letters on separate notecards.
 Place the cards facedown, and take turns flipping two at a time to find a match (e.g., A, a). Say the name and sound of each letter you match.
- Skill Word Bingo: Create bingo cards with skill words. Call out words for your child to match.
- **Pattern Find:** Read a book together. Have your child point out words with the pattern(s) they are learning.



Ways to Read

- Choral Reading: Read a book together simultaneously.
- Take Turns: Take turns reading sentences, paragraphs, or pages of a book.
- Performance Reading: Encourage your child to read a passage as if he or she is performing it.



Spell and Write

- Letter Formation: Practice writing each letter while saying its name and sound out loud (e.g., "M. M spells mmm.").
- Word Play: Write a skill word. Take turns changing one letter or pattern at a time to write new words (e.g., dog > do<u>t</u> > <u>p</u>ot > p<u>a</u>t).
- Summarize: Use skill words to write what happened at the beginning, middle, and end of a story.
