"What a spill!" she says.

"Yes, and it is slick. Sly will spin and spin if we do not get it up," Officer Jill tells Beth.



Sloth goes to get rocks to block the path. He was not looking. He had a slip on the spill! The slush went this way, and Sloth went that way! Sloth fell in the slush, but Sly did not.


