"I cannot lie," she sighed.

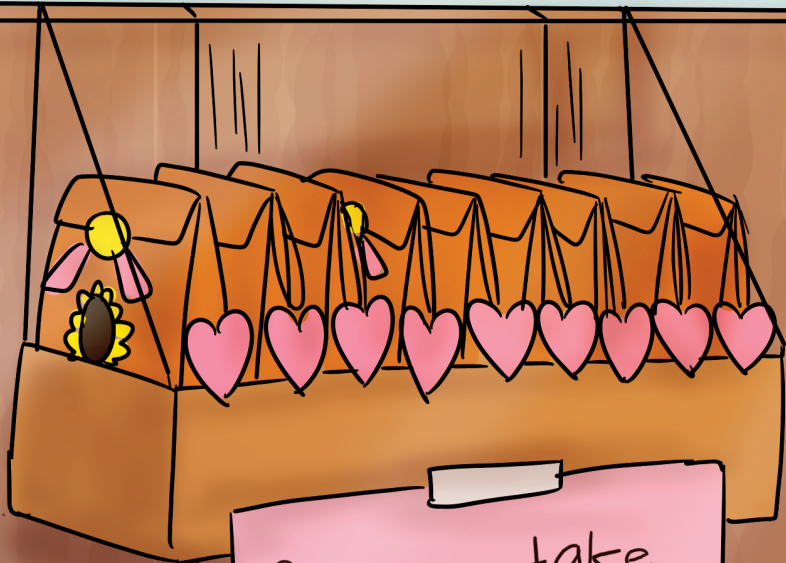
"Keeping seeds from the birds might not be easy!" she cried.



Righley had to get the seeds before the birds. She tried to have fun. She put the seeds in bags and tied them tight. She used bright ribbon to tie the bags just right.



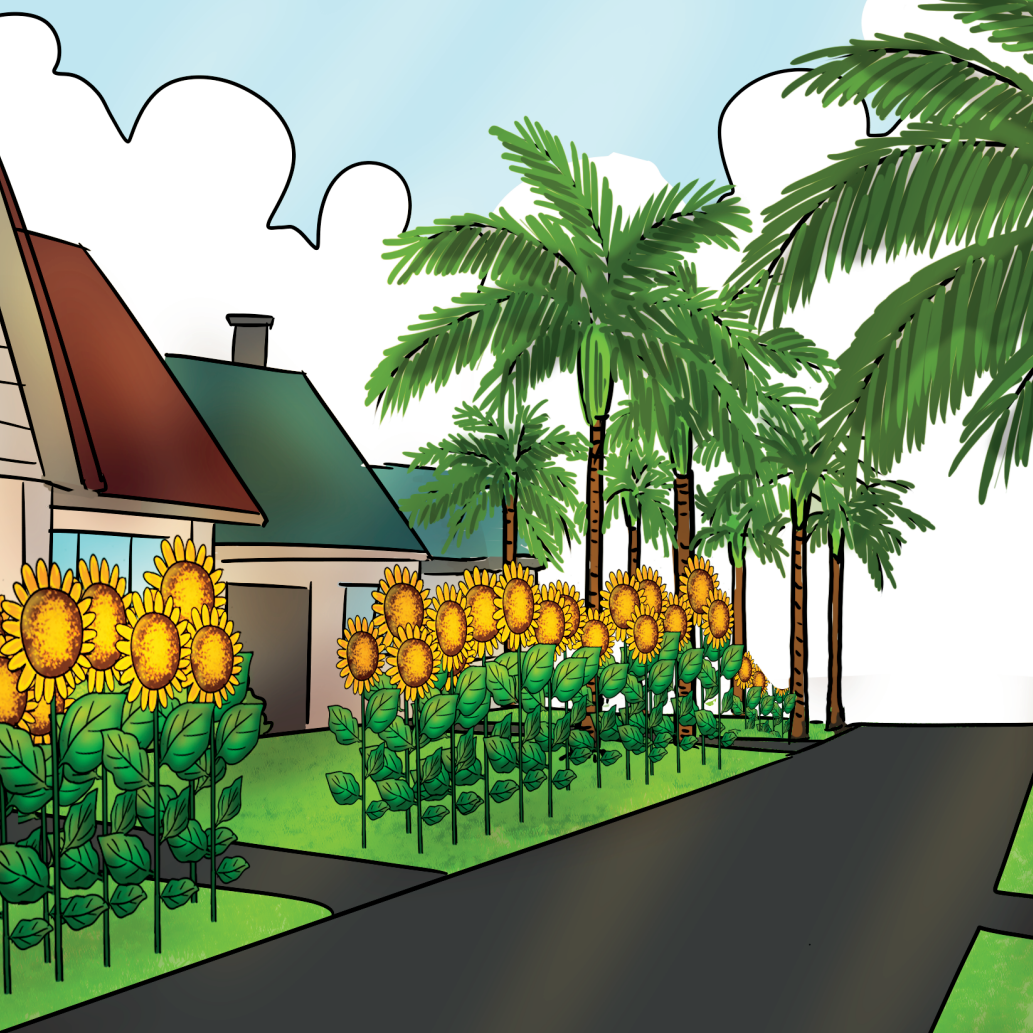
Righley put a bright sign on the gate. She hoped folks would plant seeds right in their yards. Righley was delighted as friends untied the bags.
