

Multisensory Activities

Support your child's reading journey by engaging multiple senses at once!



Use letter tiles, magnetic letters, buttons, chips, or beads!

- Build decodable words
- Identify which position the target phonics skill is located in a word
- Practice blending the sounds of a word together by moving the chips with each sound



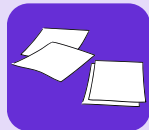
Use sand, rice, shaving cream, dry erase boards, or gel in a sealable bag!

- Practice writing the target phonics skill while saying it out loud
- Practice spelling the decodable words while saying them out loud
- Practice separating the words into their different sounds



Use a mirror or front facing camera!

- Practice reading the decodable words while watching mouth movements
- Practice reading the decodable words, or the target phonics skill, voiced and unvoiced while looking at the mouth movements
- Try finding other words that make similar mouth movements



Use paper!

- Create a paper chain of decodable words. Add links when new decodable words are learned
- Create a folder, or use a notebook, to record each targeted phonics skill and connected decodable words
- Create a wall of sound to record the target phonics skill and connected decodable words



No additional supplies needed!

- Finger-tap (or Arm-tap) for different sounds when reading decodable words
- Arm-spell in the air while voicing the different sounds
- Listen and jump (or step, clap, or other movement of choice) when the target phonics skill is found in a word
