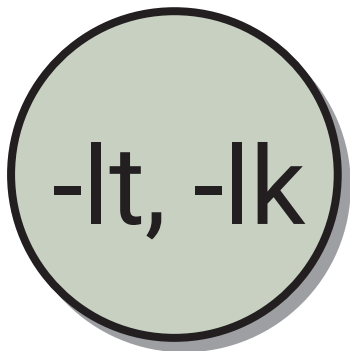

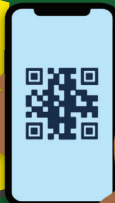
New Vocabulary

said.



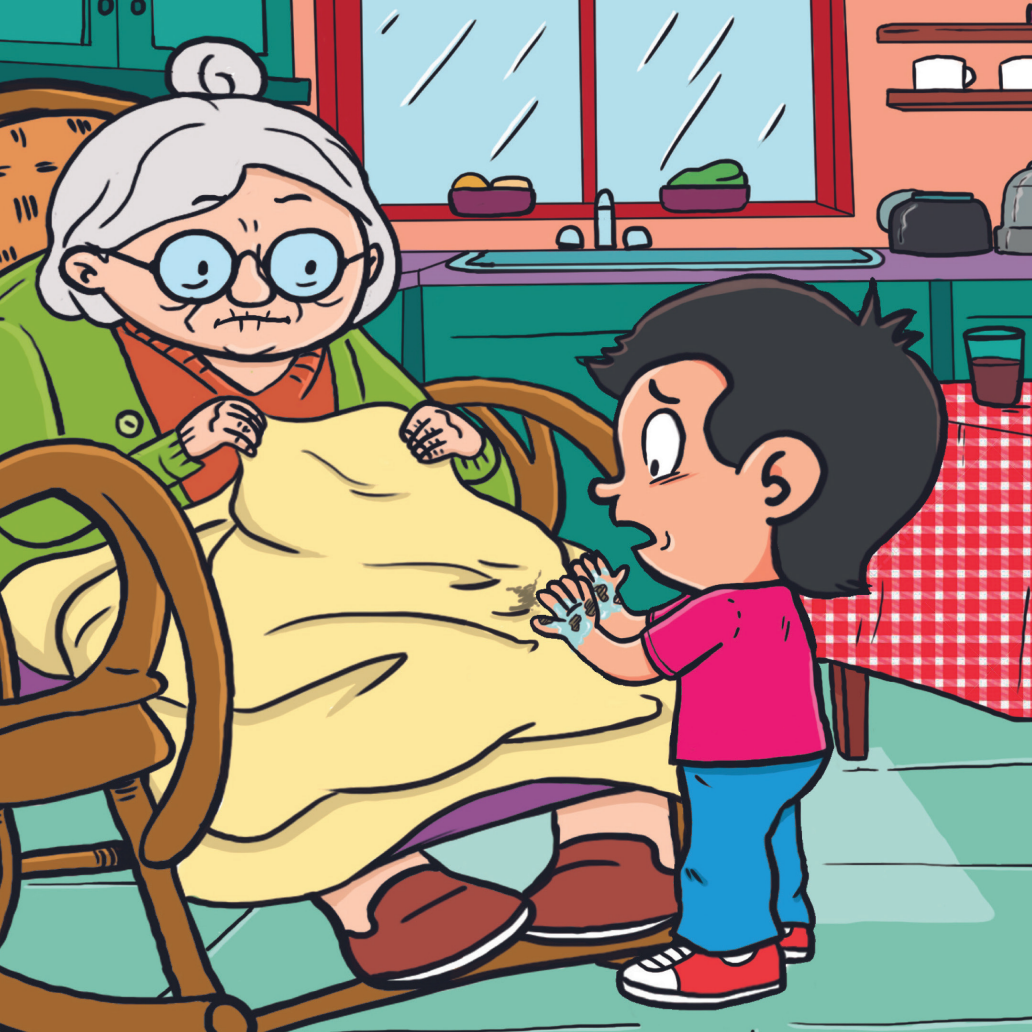
"Oh no, halt!" Walt said.
