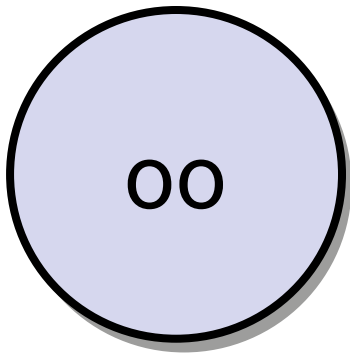

For her birthday, Brooklyn got a book about space.

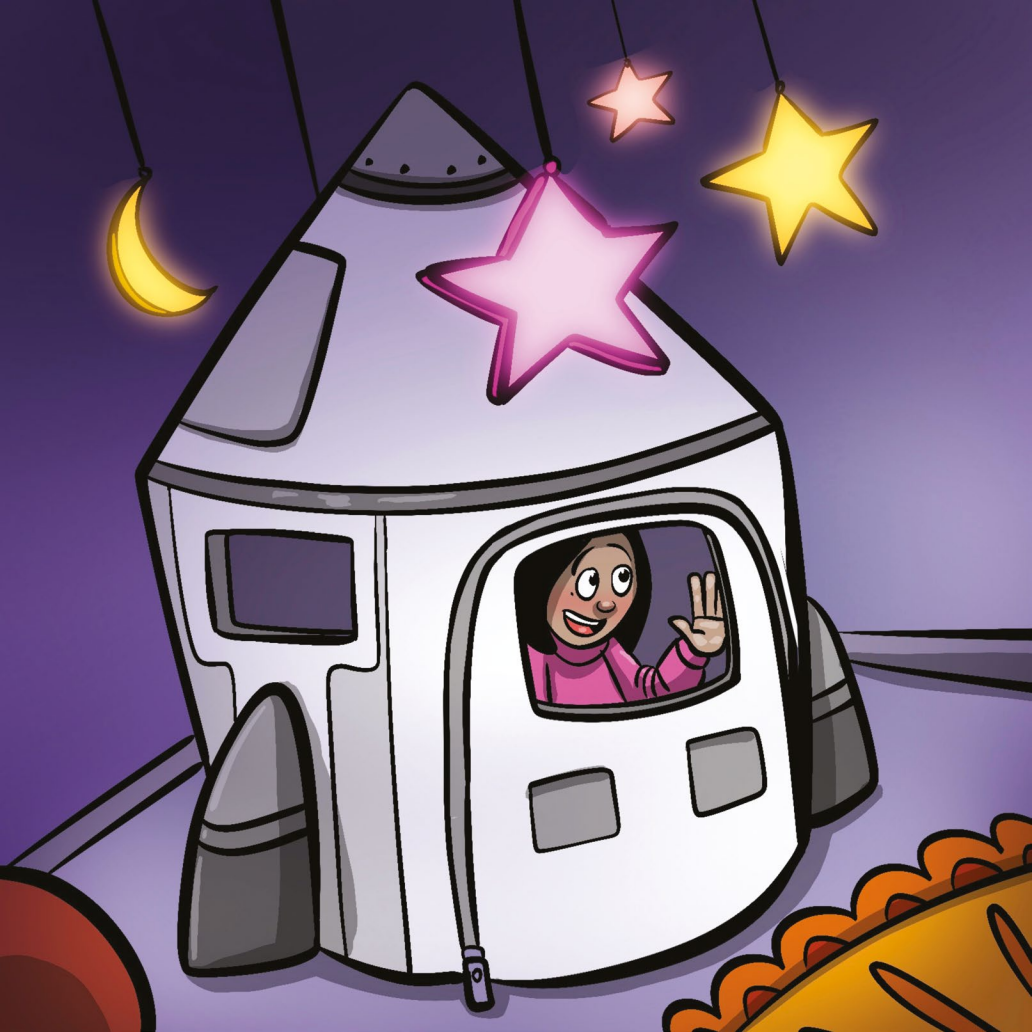
"This is so cool!"

Brooklyn was shook. This wasn't looking too good!

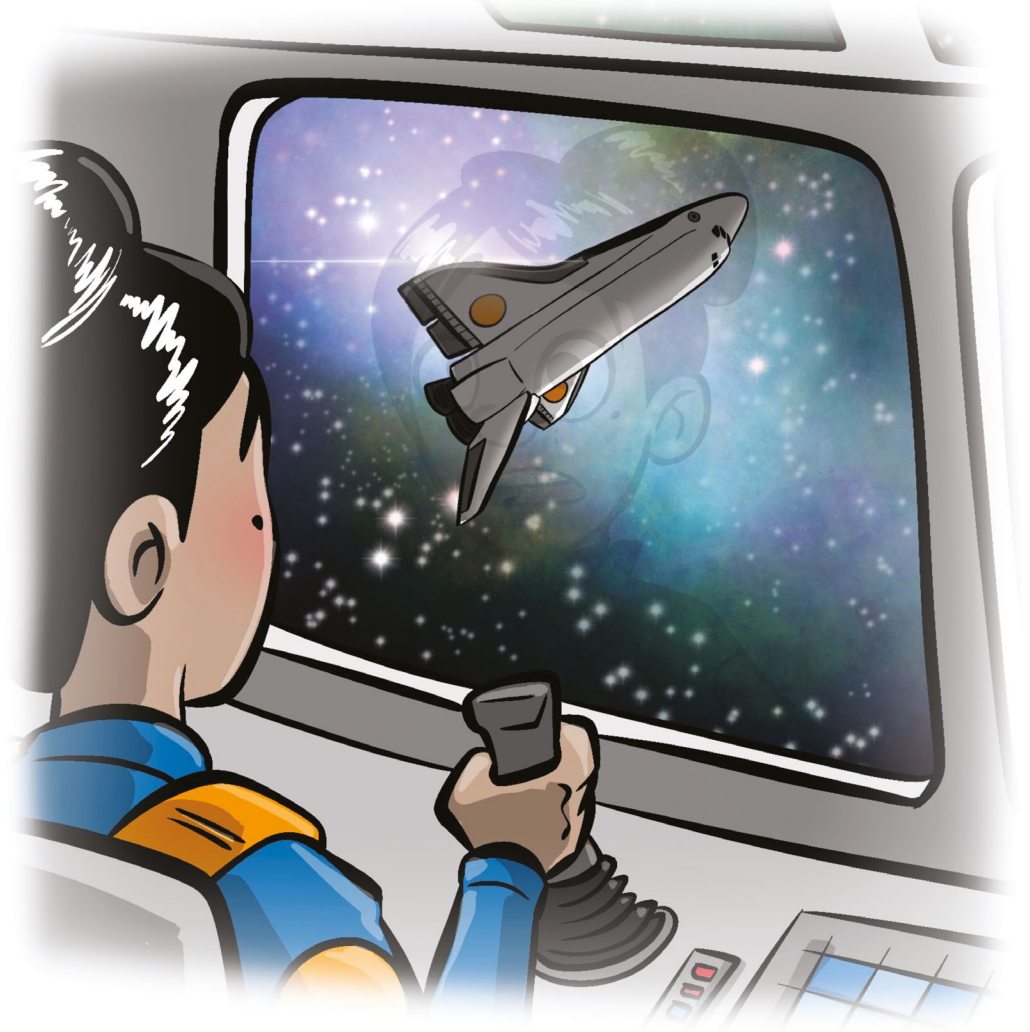


Brooklyn jumped into a ship and zoomed into the sky. The stranded ship was spinning.

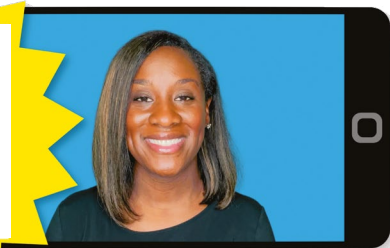
