up in a tree.

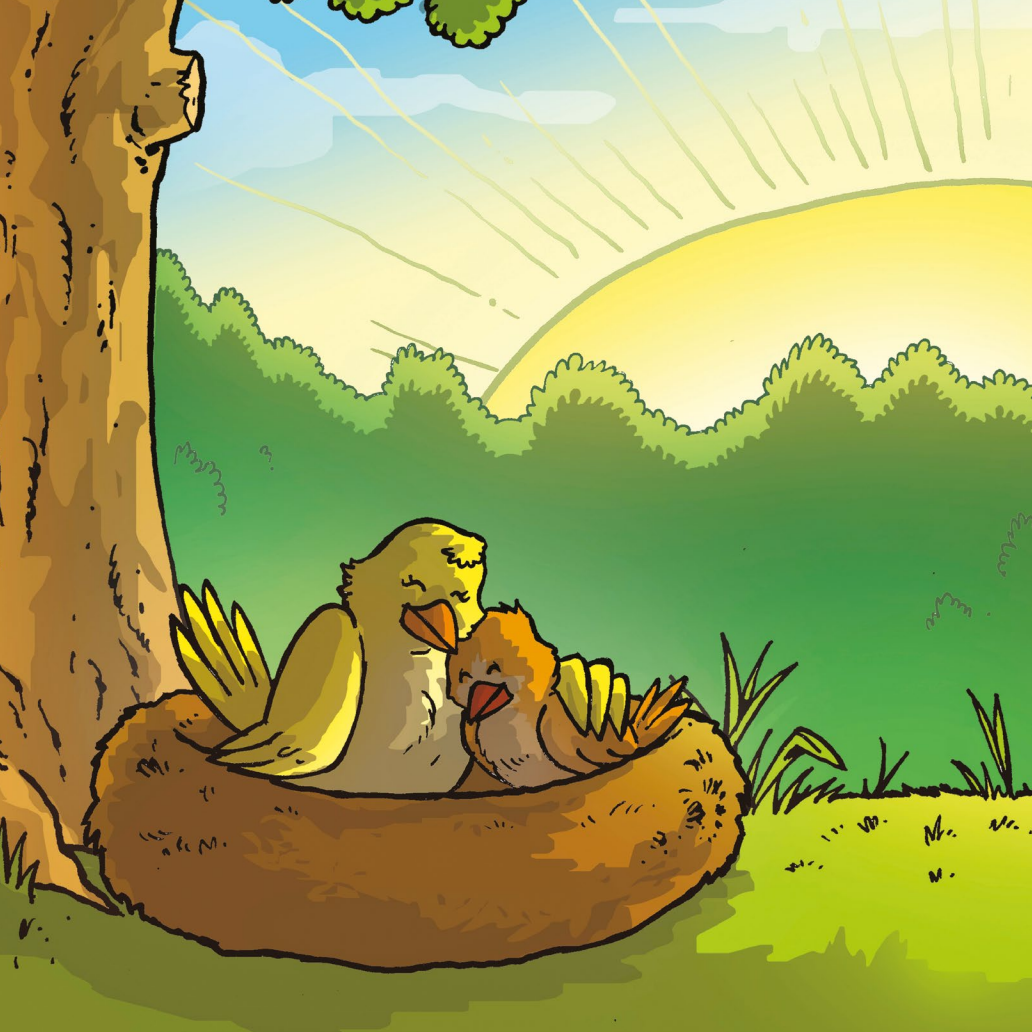
"Good day, Mr. Nightingale!" Dwight

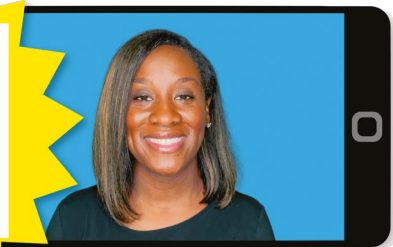
