




Roy, Joy, and their team toil on Roy and Joy's farm all year. Though today, they are taking their crop to the market!

"Oh boy," says Roy. "The horses are set."




Joy points to the eight horses.

All eight horses set off. They are bringing eight boxes of boysenberries, eighteen cans of corn oil, and eighty pumpkins. There's also an eighteen pound radish!



Roy and Joy are overjoyed when they see their neighbors and their sheep.

The horses neigh at the sheep.

Joy turns the wagon to avoid hitting them.



Joy calls, "Whoa!" and the eight horses stop in front of the market.

The team unloads the eight boxes of boysenberries, eighteen cans of corn oil, and eighty pumpkins. They list the costs by weight. Some of the pumpkins weigh more than eight pounds.

Roy unloads the eighteen pound radish himself.



Later, the weigher says, "Roy and Joy's prize radish wins! It's eighteen pounds!"

They cut it with an ax!

They share the eighteen pound radish. The folks enjoy it.

"Oh boy. That's tasty!"



Roy and Joy have no boysenberries, corn oil, or pumpkins left. Roy only has eight bits of radish. So, they give them to the horses.

"You never disappoint us though," says Roy. "You toiled and toiled some more. You got the crop to market, and it didn't spoil!"
