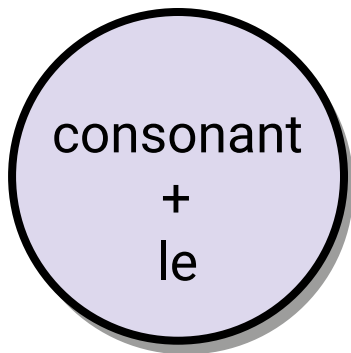

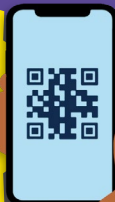

He shuffles over to put the eggs in the middle of the table.

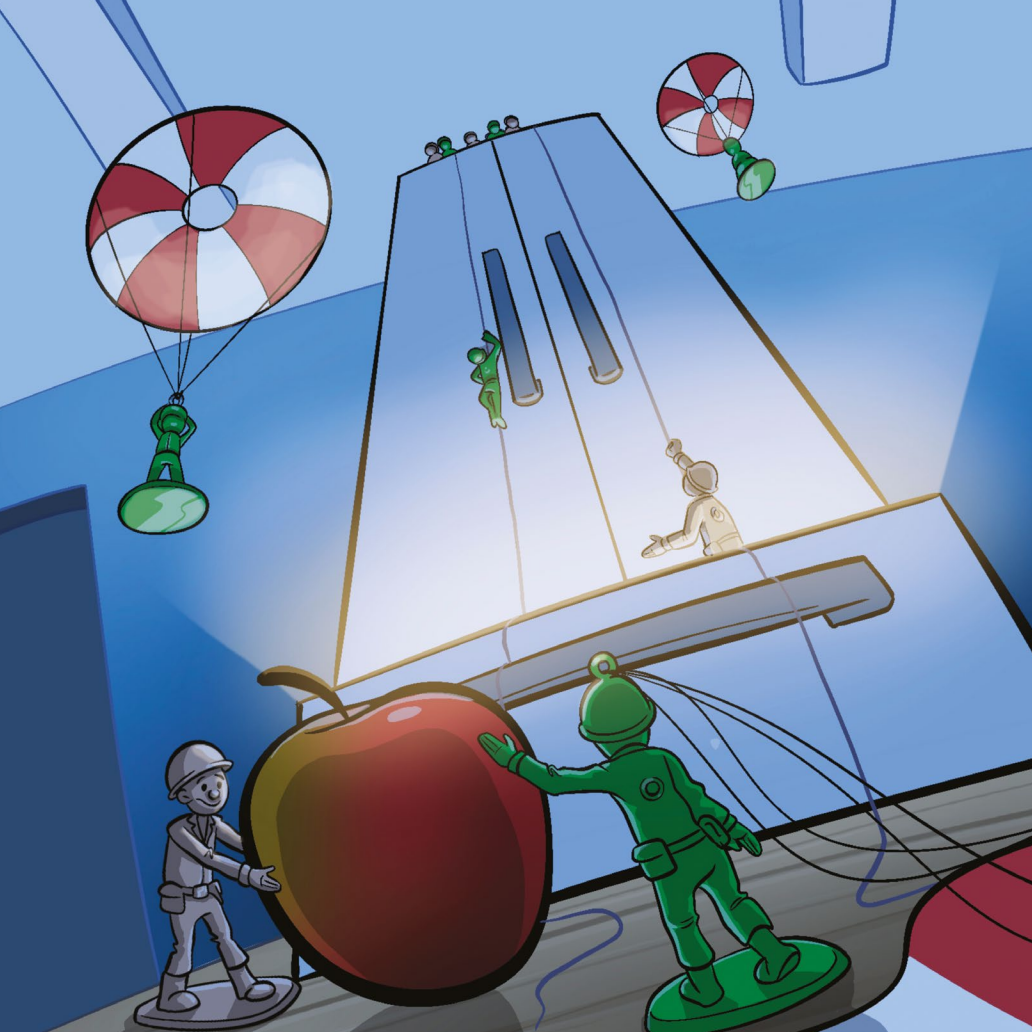


"Or maybe my stuffed purple cow

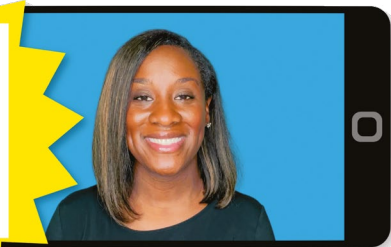
