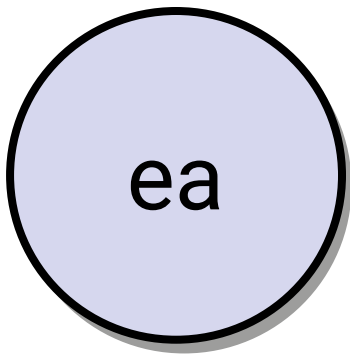

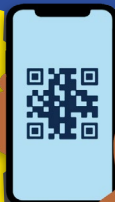
## New Vocabulary

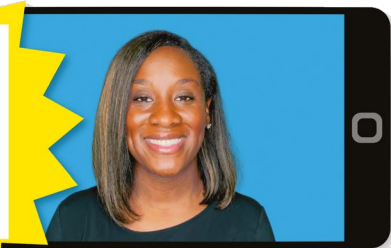
